 - a. Discussion of possible revision to SERC policy 8.1, Hazardous Materials Response Plan and Exercise, with regard to the Local Emergency Planning Committees' (LEPCs) or State Agency's Level of Response Declaration when Mutual Aid Agreements are in place (Discussion/For Possible Action)

 This item addresses the declared Level of Response of a LEPC or State agency, when there is a mutual aid agreement with an entity which has a level higher than the LEPC or State agency itself. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to provide clarification of the Level of Response in the hazmat emergency response plan. The Policy Committee made no recommendation to change SERC policy.

- b. Discussion of possible revision to SERC policy 8.1, Hazardous Materials Response Plan and Exercise, with regard to LEPC review of equipment and contact lists (Discussion/ For Possible Action) – This item addresses the possible revision of SERC policy 8.1 regarding allowance for notification of LEPC review of equipment and contact lists, and advise no updates are necessary. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to continue to require updates to the hazmat emergency response plan. The Policy Committee made no recommendation to change SERC policy.
- c. Discussion of possible revision to SERC policy 8.2, Grant Application, Grant Awards, and SERC policy 8.2a, License Plate Funding Grant Application, Grant Awards with regard to required quotations for items requested in grant applications (Discussion/For Possible Action) – This item addresses the possible revision of SERC policies 8.2 and 8.2a with regard to requiring two quotes. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to allow an explanation when two quotes are not available.
- d. Discussion of possible revision to SERC policy 8.2, Grant Application, Grant Awards, and SERC policy 8.2a, License Plate Funding Grant Application, Grant Awards regarding inclusion of questionnaire for radio purchases (Discussion/For Possible Action) – This item addresses the possible revision of SERC policies 8.2 and 8.2a with regard to inclusion of a questionnaire for radio purchases to ensure compliance with the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP). The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to include a questionnaire with grant applications. The Policy Committee made no recommendation to change SERC policy.
- e. Discussion of possible revision to SERC policy 8.2a, License Plate Funding Grant Application, Grant Awards with regard to evaluation factors for grant applications (Discussion/For Possible Action) – This item addresses the possible revision to policy 8.2a with regard to the evaluation factors for the United We Stand grant application; and if all evaluation factors should be required for all items in the applications. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to modify the evaluation factors.
- f. Discussion of possible revisions to SERC policy 8.3, Certified Assurances and Compliance Certification, with regard to LEPC membership (Discussion/For Possible Action) – This item addresses the possible revision of SERC policy 8.3 to include the specific groups or categories of LEPC membership pursuant to EPCRA and U.S. EPA recommendations. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to continue to require the 13 LEPC membership categories as noted on the membership form. The Policy Committee made no recommendation to change SERC policy.

- g. Discussion of possible revision to SERC policy 8.3, Certified Assurances and Compliance Certification, with regard to the LEPCs ability to appoint alternate members (Discussion/For Possible Action) – This item addresses the ability of LEPCs to appoint alternate members for voting purposes, to be approved by SERC. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to allow the designation of alternate members if permitted in the LEPC Bylaws.
- h. Review management of Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Plans, specifically with regard to plans being marked confidential (Discussion/For Possible Action) This item addresses whether hazardous materials emergency response plans submitted by LEPCs and state agencies are subject to public review pursuant to the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), or confidential pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 239c. The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation to require the submission of a public hazmat emergency response plan in compliance with EPCRA. The Policy Committee made no recommendation to change SERC policy.
- i. Discussion regarding the confidentiality of the Nevada Online Hazardous Materials Reporting System (Discussion/For Possible Action) – The SERC will consider the Policy Committee's recommendation regarding the confidentiality of the Nevada Online Hazmat Reporting system, information and records relating to the same, responses to requests for information and other pertinent matters.
- j. Discussion of the Presidential Executive Order regarding chemical safety (Discussion/For Possible Action) – This item addresses the Executive Order issued by the President of the United States on August 1, 2013 to establish a Chemical Facility Safety and Security working group to improve safety and security. No action is recommended by the Policy Committee.
