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owner thereof or any person, firm, corporation, or other organization offers to the Douglas County local emergency management agency, equipment, supplies, materials or funds by way of gift, grant or loan for purposes of emergency or disaster management, the board of county commissioners, the director, or county manager may accept such offer. (Ord. 1346, 2011)

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2.24.100 Removal of structures, debris or other hazards.

During an emergency or disaster the director may order the removal of structures, debris or other hazards which threaten the public health, safety or welfare. Upon the failure of a person or company to comply with such order or direction, the director may take the necessary action to remove the hazards. If the director is required to take such action, the property owner shall be liable for the costs incurred and the District Attorney's Office or other authorized legal representative may file suit to recover those costs. (Ord. 1346, 2011)

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2.24.110 Hazardous material incidents and recovery of costs

The Douglas County District Attorney's Office or other authorized legal representative may recover the amount of any costs incurred by the county, East Fork Fire and Paramedic Districts, Tahoe-Douglas Fire Department or any other special interest district located within Douglas County in responding to the spill of, or accident involving, hazardous material from the person responsible for any hazardous material involved in a spill or accident pursuant to NRS 459.770. (Ord. 1346, 2011)

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2.24.120 Unlawful acts and Penalty

It is a misdemeanor, as defined by DCC 1.08.010, for any person during a disaster emergency:

- A. To willfully obstruct, hinder or delay any member of the emergency operations organization in the enforcement of any lawful rule or regulation imposed upon him by virtue of this chapter.
- B. To do any act forbidden by any lawful rule or regulation issued pursuant to this chapter, if such act is of such a nature as to imperil the lives or property of inhabitants of this county, or to prevent, hinder or delay the protection thereof, or to give or be likely to give assistance to the enemy.
- C. To wear, carry or display, without authority, any means of identification specified by the State office of emergency management or the county. (Ord. 1346, 2011; Ord. 729, 1995; Ord. 645, §2, 1994; Ord. 190 §10, 1971)

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
