Narrative of use of Hazardous Materials Plan

Exercise Overview

During calendar year 2025, Churchill County, the City of Fallon, and Naval Air Station Fallon conducted a series of functional exercises designed to evaluate interagency coordination and response capabilities across multiple threat scenarios. After Action Reports (AARs) for the entire exercises were developed by the U.S. Navy and are not publicly releasable. A summary of relevant exercise activities is provided in the enclosed correspondence from NAS Fallon Emergency Manager, Mr. Robert C. Frank, CIV USN (USA).

Exercise Focus

The most recent functional exercise evaluated primary and redundant communications capabilities during a simulated earthquake incident in accordance with the Churchill County Multi-Jurisdictional Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP). Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs) at both NAS Fallon and Churchill County were activated and staffed. Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) volunteers were deployed to support communications operations at each location.

Capabilities Evaluated

The exercise assessed the following communications systems and network capabilities:

- Internal EOC Wi-Fi connectivity for operational devices
- County EOC Starlink satellite communications, including:
 - Internal email access
 - Voice-over-IP communications with the NAS Fallon EOC
- City cellular phone connectivity with the NAS Fallon EOC
- County EOC / ARES amateur radio communications with the NAS Fallon EOC
- Mobile Verizon hotspot support for City devices
- City satellite phone connectivity with the NAS Fallon EOC

Narrative of Corrective Actions

Corrective Actions / Improvements

- Identified corrective actions included updates to the Communications Annex of the CEMP, primarily involving revised contact information and the incorporation of newly acquired communications equipment into the County's communications inventory.
- The exercise was briefed to the entire LEPC during the September Churchill County LEPC Meeting.


