To the Citizens of Esmeralda County:

Hazardous materials are a common and important part of our everyday life. When properly controlled, these materials are useful elements in business, industry, agriculture, and at home. Uncontrolled, they may present a hazard to health and safety, property, and the environment.

To meet the risks posed by hazardous materials, the Esmeralda County Local Emergency Planning Committee is undertaking cooperative, concerted, and continuing efforts to: 1) locate, identify, and quantify hazardous materials used and transported in Esmeralda County, and 2) prepare to respond to any emergencies involving hazardous materials in the County. This plan is one important part of the overall program to address hazardous materials and implement the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know aspects of Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (Public Law 99-499).

Hazardous materials planning, response, and recovery cannot be handled successfully by any single organization or group. Rather, these efforts must be accomplished through the cooperative efforts of local, State, and Federal authorities working in cooperation with private industry.

The results of the Esmeralda County Local Emergency Planning Committee's ongoing planning efforts are set forth in this Hazardous Materials Response Plan, a supplement to the Esmeralda County Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.
