Narrative of use of Hazardous Materials Plan

7. 01/27/2025 at 1637hrs a 5000gal Tanker truck semi rolled over on Hwy 362 approximately mm 2. The cargo is Esther Alcohol (3274) and is leaking from the valves at approximately 1 to 2 gallon per minute. The trailer is on the shoulder of the north bound lane with the tractor nose towards the travel lane. The driver is injured and requires simple extrication and has a chief complaint of head and shoulder pain. Transportation Vehicle is Quality Carriers out of Los Angeles. MCFD in conjunction with Amentum Fire (HAAD fire department) conduct plugging and diking operations while EMS treats and transports patient to MGGH. Pt is eventually transported to Renown by helicopter with a closed head and orthopedic injury to his R shoulder. Sealing leaking valves with plugging and patching kits (total of 3 used) as well as diking and damming operation are finished are 1905 hrs. Commercial carrier coordinates a HAZMAT salvage company to off load the trailer, and the operation will commence on 01/28/2025 at 0700 hrs. public works and NDOT cordon off the affected area and NHP remains on scene thru the evening hours. MCFD makes periodic patrols thru the area though out the night to check for leaks. Scene is turned over to the HAZMAT mitigation company (Quality Carriers) at 0700 1/28/2025.

01/27/2025

Plan Use: Per the Mineral County Hazardous response plan, Section 6, this was a level 1 response. Responsibilities out lined in section 4 by all County and Mutual aid partners. Mineral County Fire took primary responsibility of the incident and preformed necessary containment of the hazardous materials. Local and State Law enforcement secured the scene and shut down the Highway. Mineral County Public works provided barricades for the scene. Emergency Management along with the Incident commander per Section 6 of the response plan, determined that no evacuation or shelter in place was necessary due to the location of the incident.
