#### Narrative of use of Hazardous Materials Plan

The functional exercise on October 15th, 2025 followed the hazardous materials plan in that the initial resources established command, additional resources were called for, and steps to take care of the public notifications and evacuations at a Tier II facility in TRI. Incident command system was used following the requirement of NIMS throughout the exercise. Additional resources were used from the Quad County Hazmat Response agreement, which is a multi-party agreement between regional fire departments to meet the specialized needs of hazardous materials calls. After determining the size of the spill, hot, cold, and warm exclusion zones were set up, and decontamination areas for patients and responders established. Incident priorities were set up with rescue of the patient being the first. Stopping the release and the impact to the neighborhood was the second priority, and protecting the sewer system and environment from the release the third priority. Notifications to the affected utilities and road departments took place in the exercise. This functional exercise was of a Level 1 response in the Storey County Hazardous Materials Response Plan. The location of the simulated incident would have impacted part of the Tahoe Reno Industrial Center, but due to the size of the simulated spill, it would have required a large evacuation order & shelter in place, which upgraded it to a Level 2 response per the HazMat plan. Additional hazardous material resources were needed, established procedure was simulated to request resources outside of the Quad-County HazMat multi-party agreement.

#### Narrative of Corrective Actions

While there were no major deficiencies noted, there are areas for improvement. For future exercises and training, the Quad County Hazardous Materials Response Team, need to continue training with the other agencies to improve response and mitigation times. The needed roles were filled, and the tasks accomplished, but there is room for improvement in the execution of the communications of the response between departments. Continued training will improve response and mitigation times as all the member agencies work together more.
