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Objective: Procure and deploy four Globe G-XTREME® 3.0 custom jackets and four GPS Globe custom structure fire turnouts to ensure first responders are equipped with state-of-the-art PPE for effective and safe response to emergencies, including hazardous material incidents in Lincoln County.

Justification: The Globe G-XTREME® 3.0 jackets are designed with features that maximize mobility and protection, such as the AXTION® Back and Sleeve, thermally enhanced upper body, and contoured ergonomic design. These enhancements are critical for first responders operating in hazardous environments, ensuring both safety and operational efficiency. Equipping our team with this advanced PPE aligns with our commitment to maintaining high safety standards and readiness for hazardous material incidents.

Objective: Obtain one Hurst SC 358 E3 Connect Combi Tool, two Hurst

EWXT/E3 25.2V/9aH batteries, and one EWXT/E3 110-240V charger to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of first responders during emergency situations, particularly those involving hazardous materials in transportation incidents within Lincoln County and surrounding areas.

Justification: The Hurst SC 358 E3 Connect Combi Tool is a versatile, batterypowered device capable of both cutting and spreading, essential for rapid extrication in emergencies. Its compact design and smart dashboard provide real-time feedback, improving operational control and safety. The accompanying 25.2V/9aH batteries ensure extended operational time, and the universal charger facilitates readiness across various scenarios. Integrating this equipment into our emergency response toolkit will significantly enhance our capability to manage and mitigate hazardous material incidents effectively

The Lincoln County Emergency Manager will oversee the purchase and implementation of the equipment & PPE to the various agencies in Lincoln County.

This objective to be initiated by July 31, 2025 upon completion of award of grant and monies being made available.

III. BUDGETS:

Planning:

Requests to contract with a consultant must be accompanied by at least two competitive bids. The bids must include an itemized quote and detailed scope of work from the consultant.

Training:

All training requests other than conferences must first be made through the State Fire Marshal's office (SFM) and the Department of Emergency Management (DEM). If the SFM or DEM declines the training, the request may be included in the allocation application along with the letter of declination.

Requests to contract to provide training must be accompanied by at least two competitive bids. The bids must include an itemized quote and detailed scope of work from the consultant.

State per diem rates (which generally follow the federal GSA rates; (<u>http://www.gsa.gov</u>) will prevail unless local rates are less. Travel eligibility requirements and rates are further defined in SERC policy 8.5. The rates listed below are for the calendar year 2024 only and are subject to change.

If a privately owned vehicle is used for agency convenience, mileage may be reimbursed at the State rate, currently .655 cents per mile. If a personal vehicle is used for personal convenience, the reimbursement allowed is .3275 cents per mile. If an agency vehicle is used, reimbursement may be made for fuel charges based on receipt or agency fuel logs. Airport parking (most economical lot only) and ground transportation expenses are reimbursable upon presentation of receipts. Rental cars must be pre-approved by the SERC.

1. Structural Turnouts Description: We propose acquiring advanced structural firefighting protective ensembles, commonly known as turnouts, to replace

existing gear approaching the end of its service life. These turnouts are designed in accordance wit the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1971 standard, ensuring they provide optimal protection against thermal, physical, environmental, and bloodborne pathogen hazards.

- 2. Benefit and Necessity: Ensuring that our first responders are equipped with up-to-date, compliant protective gear is essential for their safety during hazardous material incidents. Replacing outdated turnouts aligns with NFPA guidelines.
- 3. Extrication Equipment
- 4. Description: We intend to acquire specialized extrication equipment, specifically the Hurst SC 358 E3 Connect Combi Tool, along with compatible batteries and a charger. This battery-powered device is engineered for both cutting and spreading operations, essential for rapid extrication in emergencies involving hazardous materials.
- 5. Benefit and Necessity: The Hurst SC 358 E3 Connect Combi Tool's versatility and portability make it indispensable for first responders dealing with complex extrication scenarios, especially in remote areas of Lincoln County. Its design facilitates efficient operations without the constraints of external power sources, crucial for timely interventions. Equipping our teams with this advanced tool enhances our capability to manage and mitigate hazardous material incidents effectively, ensuring the safety of both responders and the public.
- 6. By integrating these updated structural turnouts and specialized extrication equipment into our emergency response resources, we aim to elevate the safety and efficiency of our first responders. This initiative directly supports our overarching goal of protecting the health and welfare of Lincoln County's residents and visitors by ensuring our emergency services are wellequipped and prepared for hazardous material incidents.
- 7. Given Lincoln County's vast area of nearly 11,000 square miles, our first responders often face extended response times. Equipping them with reliable, compliant turnouts and the latest battery powered extrication tools enhances their operational effectiveness and safety during prolonged hazardous material incidents.

Operations -

Members of the Lincoln County LEPC all perform volunteer functions within their emergency agency without clerical support. Part time clerical support is vital for the LEPC to meet state mandated requirements as well as for grant application management and reporting. Salary to be determined based upon a maximum monthly rate of \$150.00.

Upon acceptance of funding from the State of Nevada Emergency Response Commission (SERC), the applicant and the lead governmental unit hereby agree to the following Certified Assurances governing the awarding of funds:

- A) The recipient assured compliance with the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 459.9912 et seq. and SERC policies found at <u>http://serc.nv.gov</u>.
- B) FINANCIAL REPORTS The recipient is required to submit, at a minimum, quarterly financial report to the SERC. Reporting must be made in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, and SERC Policies 8.5 and 8.6.

No expenditures or obligations will be eligible for reimbursement if occurring prior to or after the award period. All funds need to be obligated by the end of the allocation period and expended by the final report date as stated in the allocation award cover letter. Failure to submit proper reports pursuant to current policies may jeopardize future funding from the SERC.

- Request for advance: May be requested only if expenses total over \$2,000.00 and is accompanied by a dated purchase order or quote. Complete and submit a financial report form with the appropriate "request for advance" box checked.
- 2) Report on expenditure of advance: Show the actual expenditure of the advanced funds. Complete and submit a financial report form with the appropriate "report on expenditure of advance" box checked. This report is due within 30 days of the date of the advanced check and must include copies of dated invoices and proof of payment. If the amount advanced is more than the amount spent or the advanced amount is not spent within the 30 days, the unexpended funds are to be returned to the SERC within 45 days of the date of the check.
- 3) Request for reimbursement: Complete and submit a financial report form, at a minimum quarterly, for all expenditures funded by the allocation. Include a summary breakdown of expenses, copies of dated invoices, proof of payment and any other documents required by SERC policies. Any other form of documentation for expenditures must be approved by the SERC staff. If additional funds are used toward the project, report those expenditures as a match in the appropriate line on the report form.

- 4) **Quarterly report required:** If there are no expenditures within the quarter, a report with an explanation of why and the plan for future expenditures is due by the end of the month following the end of the quarter. Due dates for guarterly reports are as follows:
 - October 31- for reporting period July 1 to September 30;January 31- for reporting period October 1 to December 31;April 30- for reporting period January 1 to March 31; andJuly 31- for reporting period April 1 to June 30.
- 5) **Final report:** There will be no further expenditure, the allocation is closed, and no further reports are necessary. This report is due within 45 days after the end of the award period, or any time prior to the end of the award period if no further funds are spent.
- C) **EXERCISE REPORTS** To be eligible for funding, the state agency must report to the SERC by January 31st of each year on at least one real event and/or tabletop, functional, or full-scale exercise or drill which utilizes and implements the hazardous materials emergency response plan. An exercise is required at least once every third year.
- D) CHANGE REQUEST Allocation expenditures are authorized for the purposes set forth in this application, as approved in the allocation award, and in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and policies and procedures of the State of Nevada and the applicable federal granting agency. Request for change in the project must be submitted to the SERC and approved in writing prior to its implementation. Approval may be required by the Funding Committee if the change is significant (SERC Policy 8.7).
- E) The recipient assures, through the submission of the application for funding, neither the lead agency, county government nor any of its participating agencies are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in the transaction by any federal department or agency.
- F) The recipient assures the fiscal accountability of the funds received from the State Emergency Response Commission will be managed and accounted for by the lead agency's chief comptroller and internal control and authority to ensure compliance with SERC's documentation, record keeping, accounting, and reporting guidelines will reside with that individual.
- G) SERC will reimburse the recipient reasonable, allowable, allocable cost of performance, in accordance with current federal requirements, Nevada Revised Statute, Nevada Administrative Code, State Administrative Manual, SERC policies and any other applicable fiscal rules, not to exceed the amount specified at the total award amount.

- H) The recipient assures it shall maintain data and information to provide accurate financial reports to SERC. Said reports shall be provided in form, by due dates and containing data and information as SERC reasonably requires to administer the program.
- I) The recipient assures financial reports shall be submitted within 30 calendar days of the end of each calendar quarter and within 45 days of the end of the project period and shall be current and actual.
- J) The recipient assures funds made available under this allocation will not be used to supplant state or local funds.
- K) The recipient assures that it will comply with applicable federal cost principles and administrative requirements appropriate to the allocation as follows:

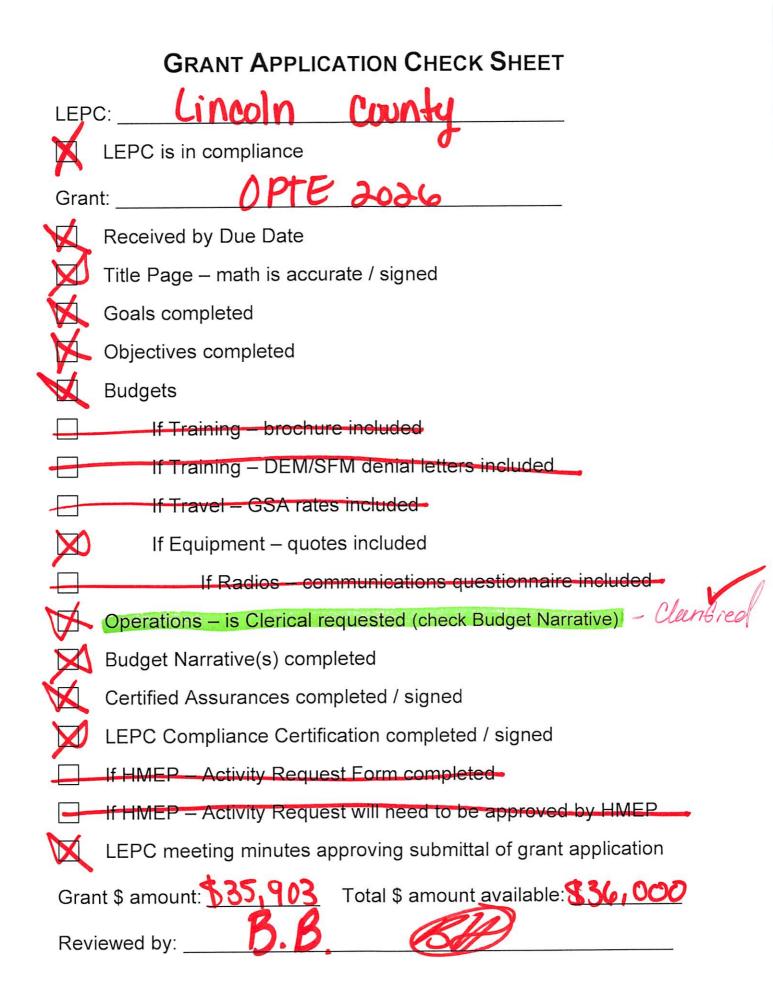

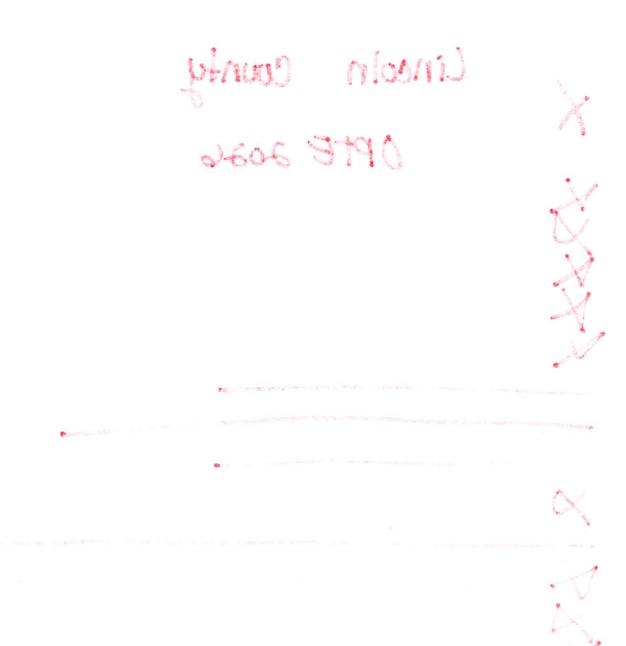

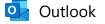
